PARISH CHURCH OF ST. MARY THE VIRGIN, MENDLESHAM. ADVENT IV - Year A

THEME: The birth of Jesus is almost upon us. Today's Mass reminds us he is the long-awaited Emmanuel; God is amongst us now, and we will receive Him into our hearts and so we ask his forgiveness of one another.

Entrance Hymn: 365 v. 1 – 4.

PENITENTIAL RITE

Celebrant: Forgive us, Lord, when we are afraid of your challenge to our selfishness; when we prefer darkness to light; when we cut ourselves off from our neighbours who are the lifelines you have sent us. Lord have mercy.

People: (sing) Kyrie Eleison (Ukrainian setting)

Celebrant: Forgive us, Lord, when we show lack of understanding, when we are impatient and judge harshly; when we look for rewards to boost our self esteem. Christ have mercy. **People:** Christe Eleison

Celebrant: Forgive us, Lord, when we are uncritical of society and its superficial values; when we condone evil and contribute to the suffering of today. Lord have mercy.

People: Kyrie Eleison

Celebrant proclaims God's forgiveness No Gloria in Advent..

OPENING PRAYER: Let us pray as Advent draws to a close, that Christ will truly come into our hearts. Lord fill our hearts with your love, and as you revealed to us by an angel the coming of your son as man, so lead us through His suffering and death to the glory of His resurrection, for He lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever.

LITURGY OF THE WORD OF GOD.

First reading – Isaiah 7 v.10-14: We hear the celebrated prophecy from Isaiah which Christian tradition has seen as foretelling the Virgin Birth of Christ.

The Lord spoke to Ahaz and said, 'Ask the Lord your God for a sign for yourself coming either from the depths of Sheol or from the heights above.' 'No,' Ahaz answered 'I will not put the Lord to the test.'

Then Isaiah said: 'Listen now, House of David: are you not satisfied with trying the patience of men without trying the patience of my God, too? The Lord himself, therefore, will give you a sign. It is this: the maiden is with child and will soon give birth to a son whom she will call Immanuel, a name which means "God-is-withus."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Ps 24 ® Let the Lord enter! He is the King of Glory.

The Lord is the earth and its fullness, the world and all its peoples. It is He who set it on the seas: on the waters He made it firm. ®

Who shall climb the mountain of the Lord? Who shall stand in his Holy place?

The man with clean hands and pure heart, who desires not worthless things. ® He shall receive blessings from the Lord and reward from the God who saves him. Such are the men who seek him, seek the face of the God of Jacob. ®

Second Reading – Romans 1 v. 1-7: St. Paul begins his letter to the Romans by explaining the Gospel he is preaching. Salvation comes through Jesus Christ who was descended from David, and is proclaimed Son of God in his resurrection.

From Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus who has been called to be an apostle, and specially chosen to preach the Good News that God promised long ago through his prophets in the scriptures.

This news is about the Son of God who, according to the human nature he took was a descendant of David: it is about Jesus Christ our Lord who, in the order of the spirit, the spirit of holiness that was in him, was proclaimed Son of God in all his power through his resurrection from the dead. Through him we received grace and our apostolic mission to preach the obedience of faith to all pagan nations in honour of his name. You are one of these nations, and by his call belong to Jesus Christ. To you all, then, who are God's beloved in Rome, called to be saints, may God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ send grace and peace.

Gospel Hymn: 365 v. 5 - 6.

Alleluia, alleluia! The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Emmanuel, a name which means 'God with us' Alleluia!

Gospel – Matthew 1 v. 18-25: Matthew quotes the ancient prophecy of Isaiah to show that Jesus is Emmanuel – God with us.

This is how Jesus Christ came to be born. His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph; but before they came to live together she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph; being a man of honour and wanting to spare her publicity, decided to divorce her informally. He had made up his mind to do this when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because she has conceived what is in her by the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus, because he is the one who is to save his people from their sins.'

Now all this took place to fulfil the words spoken by the Lord through the prophet: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and they will call him Emmanuel, a name which means 'God-is-with-us.' When Joseph woke up he did what the angel of the Lord had told him to do: he took his wife to his home.
