THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Hatred does more damage to the person in which it is stored than to the person on whom it is poured.

THEME: The Mass today emphasizes the authority of the Church vested in each one of us. We all share responsibility for the quality of life in the Church. We cannot ignore our brothers' welfare, as St. Paul reminds us: "You must love your neighbour as yourself". We ask God's forgiveness for sometimes avoiding our responsibilities; when we have seen injustice and been silent; when we have judged our neighbour harshly.

PENITENTIAL RITE

Celebrant: Forgive us for the times we have ignored the needs of others and shrugged them off with words like "it's his business". Lord have mercy.

People: **LORD HAVE MERCY**

Celebrant: Forgive us when we do not open our hearts to those we have injured or those who have injured us. Christ have mercy.

People: **CHRIST HAVE MERCY**

Celebrant: Forgive us for the times we refuse to forget the past and trust you. Lord have mercy.

People: **LORD HAVE MERCY**

OPENING PRAYER: Let us pray that we may realise the freedom God has given us in making us his sons and daughters. God our Father, you redeem us and make us your children in Christ. Look upon us, give us true freedom and bring us to the inheritance you promised.

LITURGY OF THE WORD OF GOD

First Reading – Ezekiel 33 v. 7 - 9: Ezekiel is commanded by the Lord to call Israel to repentance. It is important that we accept our responsibility to guide people in the ways of God. Others may, or may not, listen and act upon what we say. The main thing is that we try.

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows: 'Son of man, I have appointed you as sentry to the House of Israel. When you hear a word from my mouth, warn them in my name. If I say to a wicked man: Wicked wretch, you are to die, and you do not speak to warn the wicked man to renounce his ways, then he shall die for his sin, but I will hold you responsible for his death. If, however, you do warn a wicked man to renounce his ways and repent, and he does not repent, then he shall die for his sin, but you yourself will have saved your life.'

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 94

Ⓜ **O that today you would listen to his voice! Harden not your hearts.**

Come, ring out our joy to the Lord; hail the rock who saves us.
Let us come before him, giving thanks, with songs let us hail the Lord. Ⓜ

Come in; let us bow and bend low; let us kneel before the God who made us
for he is our God and we the people who belong to his pasture,
the flock that is led by his hand. Ⓜ

O that today you would listen to his voice! Harden not your hearts as at Meribah,
as on that day at Massah in the desert when your fathers put me to the test;
when they tried me, though they saw my work. Ⓜ

Second Reading – Romans 13 v. 8 – 10: If we want to sum up the way of life
we must follow as Christians, we need use only one word: love. Love is the
answer to every one of the commandments.

*Avoid getting into debt, except the debt of mutual love. If you love your fellow
men you have carried out your obligations. All the commandments: You shall
not commit adultery, you shall not kill, you shall not steal, you shall not covet,
and so on, are summed up in this single command: You must love your
neighbour as yourself. Love is the one thing that cannot hurt your neighbour;
that is why it is the answer to every one of the commandments.*

**Alleluia, alleluia! Your word is truth O Lord, consecrate us in the truth.
Alleluia!**

Gospel - Matthew 18 v. 15-20: The Gospel reading takes up the theme of
Ezekiel. We are urged to be concerned about our brothers and sisters and not
to be afraid to point out that which is wrong.

*Jesus said to his disciples: 'If your brother does something wrong, go and have
it out with him alone, between your two selves. If he listens to you, you have
won back your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others along with
you: the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge.
But if he refuses to listen to these, report it to the community; and if he refuses
to listen to the community, treat him like a pagan or a tax collector.*

*'I tell you solemnly, whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in
heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven. 'I
tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all,
it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in
my name, I shall be there with them.'*
