OPENING PRAYER - *Let us pray that we may recognise the presence of Christ in our midst.* **Father, help us keep in mind that Christ our Saviour lives with you in glory and promised to remain with us until the end of time. Amen.**

LITURGY OF THE WORD OF GOD

First Reading – Acts 1 v 12-14 *Every Christian community must prepare itself by prayer to receive the Spirit promised by Christ.*

'After Jesus was taken up into heaven the apostles went back from the Mount of Olives, as it is called, to Jerusalem, a short distance away, no more than a sabbath walk; and when they reached the city they went to the upper room where they were staying; there were Peter and John, James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot, and Jude son of James. All these joined in continuous prayer, together with several women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.'

Responsorial Psalm – Psalm 26 **® I am sure I will see the Lord's goodness in the land of the living.**

The Lord is my light and my help;
whom shall I fear?

The Lord is the stronghold of my life;
before whom shall I shrink? **®**

There is one thing I ask of the Lord, for this I long,
to live in the house of the Lord, all the days of my life,
to savour the sweetness of the Lord, to behold his temple **®**

O Lord, hear my voice when I call;
have mercy and answer.

Of you my heart has spoken:
"Seek His face." **®**

Second Reading 1 Peter 4 v 13 - 16 *Those who share in the sufferings of Christ are truly blessed because they will share in His glory. No one should be ashamed of being a follower of Christ.*

'If you can have some share in the sufferings of Christ, be glad, because you will enjoy a much greater gladness when his glory is revealed. It is a blessing for you when they insult you for bearing the name of Christ, because it means that you have the Spirit of glory, the Spirit of God resting on you. None of you should ever deserve to suffer for being a murderer, a thief, a criminal or an informer; but if anyone of you should suffer for being a Christian, then he is not to be ashamed of it; he should thank God that he has been called one.'

Alleluia, alleluia! I will not leave you orphans, says the Lord; I will come back to you, and your hearts will be full of joy. Alleluia!

Gospel –John 17 v. 1 - 11 *As he prepares for his hour of departure and glorification Jesus prays for his disciples. Through their work on earth God's name will continue to be glorified.*

'Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said: 'Father, the hour has come: glorify your Son so that your Son may glorify you; and, through the power over all mankind that you have given him, let him give eternal life to all those you have entrusted to him. And eternal life is this: to know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent.

I have glorified you on earth and finished the work that you gave me to do. Now, Father, it is time for you to glorify me with that glory I had with you before ever the world was. I have made your name known to the men you took from the world to give me. They were yours and you gave them to me,

and they have kept your word.

Now at last they know that all you have given me comes indeed from you; for I have given them the teaching you gave to me, and they have truly accepted this, that I came from you, and have believed that it was you who sent me.

I pray for them; I am not praying for the world but for those you have given me, because they belong to you: all I have is yours and all you have is mine, and in them I am glorified.

I am not in the world any longer, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you."
