THEME: Today we rejoice together as we prepare to celebrate the Birth of the Lord and give thanks for John the Baptist who bore witness to Jesus, the Light of the World.

Penitential Rite

Celebrant: Forgive us for the absence of the signs of the Spirit in our lives, for blocking the work of the Spirit in ourselves, in others and in the community, for our failure to call on and use the power of the Spirit, for the absence of prayer in our lives, for our want of faith, hope and love. Lord have mercy.

People: **Lord Have Mercy**

Celebrant: Forgive us for being content with the minimum, for being inward looking and concerned only with our immediate family, friends, organisations and parish. Forgive us when we have passed over injustice in the Church and World. Forgive us when we have turned away so as not to see the needs of others. Christ have mercy.

People: **Christ Have Mercy**

Celebrant: Forgive us when we pretend we do not need God, when prayer is selfish, when we encourage depression and gloom, when we fail to avoid occasions of temptation, when we have been slow to forgive, when we have not shared, when we have been greedy and kept the best for ourselves. Lord have mercy.

People: **LORD HAVE MERCY**

Liturgy of The Word of God

First Reading ~ Isaiah 61v 1~2, 10~11

The prophet describes his call and mission. As we listen we may recall that Jesus applied it to Himself at the start of His ministry.

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for the Lord has anointed me. He has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to bind up hearts that are broken; to proclaim liberty to captives, freedom to those in prison; to proclaim a year of favour from the Lord.

'I exult for joy in the Lord, my soul rejoices in my God, for he has clothed me in the garments of salvation, he has wrapped me in the cloak of integrity, like a bridegroom wearing his wreath, like a bride adorned in her jewels.

'For as the earth makes fresh things grow, as a garden makes seeds spring up, so will the Lord make both integrity and praise spring up in the sight of the nations.'

Responsorial Psalm ~ Luke I: 46~50, 53~54
My soul rejoices in my God.

My soul glorifies in the Lord,
my spirit rejoices in God, my Saviour.
He looks on his servant in her nothingness;
Henceforth all ages will call me blessed. ®

The Almighty works marvels for me.

His mercy is from age to age,

Second Reading ~ 1 Thessalonians 5 v 16 ~ 24 The basic characteristic of a Christian should be happiness as we look forward to the coming of the Lord.

Be happy at all times; pray constantly; and for all things give thanks to God, because this is what God expects you to do in Christ Jesus.

Never try to suppress the Spirit or treat the gift of prophecy with contempt; think before you do anything – hold on to what is good and avoid every form of evil.

May the God of peace make you perfect and holy; and may you all be kept safe and blameless, spirit, soul and body, for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. God has called you and he will not fail you.

Alleluia, alleluia! The spirit of the Lord has been given to me. He has sent me to bring good news to the poor. Alleluia!

Gospel ~ John 1 v 6 ~ 8, 19 ~ 28 John the Baptist witnesses to the Light and points to the presence of Jesus, hidden in the ordinariness of our world.

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light.

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied: a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.'

This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

Celebrant: God sent John the Baptist to bear witness to the coming of Jesus, who would redeem the world. As followers of Jesus, let us pray to the Father for the grace to bear witness in our lives.

Let us pray for those who do not know Jesus, that the witness of Christians will open their minds and hearts to the message of the Gospels and so come to know Jesus as the Light of the World.

Let us pray for those who bring happiness to others through their work, for artists, musicians, actors and performers, especially those unable to work because of the pandemic.

May He who made the blind see, the deaf hear and the lame walk, be with us in our prayers. We pray, not for ourselves, but for those in need. Let us pray for the sick, Billy & Margaret Carter; Hazel Lockwood; Margaret Maundrell; all prayed for in Shrine Prayers and for Michael Denny & James Shave.
