Prayers for the Dead

PENITENTIAL RITE

Celebrant: Forgive us for amassing the goods and riches of the world; for idleness and sloth; for being imprisoned by circumstances and false values of society; for greed and immoderation in food and drink; for wasting the world's resources; for placing limits on our love. Lord have mercy.

People: **LORD HAVE MERCY.**

Celebrant: Forgive us for turning a deaf ear to the person in need; for counting the cost of our love; for expecting much in return when we give; for being jealous of our time; for limiting our time and love to those around us. Christ have mercy.

People: **CHRIST HAVE MERCY.**

Celebrant: Forgive us for only giving lip service; for talking too much but seldom listening; for finding it hard to believe you love us as we are; forgive us for our obsession with earning and spending money but leaving so little time for prayer and meditation; forgive us for the times we seldom say 'thank you'. Lord have mercy.

People: **LORD HAVE MERCY.**

Celebrant proclaims God's forgiveness.

OPENING PRAYER: *Let us pray that we may take Christ's coming seriously. All powerful God, increase our strength of will for doing good that Christ may find an eager welcome at his coming and call us to his side in the kingdom of heaven where he lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever.*

LITURGY OF THE WORD OF GOD

First Reading: **Isaiah 63 v. 16-17; 64 v.1, 3-8:** The prophet gives a vivid picture of the way the power of sin can imprison and deprave. Only God, like a potter, can mould us into what he would have us to be.

*You, Lord, yourself are our Father, 'Our Redeemer' is your ancient name.
 Why, Lord, leave us to stray from your ways and harden our hearts against fearing you?
 Return, for the sake of your servants, the tribes of your inheritance.
 Oh, that you would tear the heavens open and come down! – at your Presence the mountains would melt.*

*No ear has heard, no eye has seen any god but you act like this for those who trust him.
You guide those who act with integrity and keep your ways in mind.
You were angry when we were sinners; we had long been rebels against you.
We were all like men unclean, all that integrity of ours like filthy clothing.
We have all withered like leaves and our sins blew us away like the wind.
No one invoked your name or roused himself to catch hold of you.
For you hid your face from us and gave us up to the power of our sins.
And yet, Lord, you are our Father; we the clay, you the potter, we are all the work of your hand.*

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 79

Ⓜ **God of hosts, bring us back; let your face shine on us and we shall be saved.**

O shepherd of Israel, hear us, shine forth from your cherubim throne.

O Lord, rouse up your might, O Lord, come to our help. Ⓜ

Second Reading – I Corinthians 1 v. 3-9: Too often we think of Advent as a time of waiting for the child of Bethlehem. Our reading here makes it clear that what we await is nothing less than the final working out of God's plan for the world.

*May God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ send you grace and peace.
I never stop thanking God for all the graces you have received through Jesus Christ. I thank him that you have been enriched in so many ways, especially in your teachers and preachers; the witness to Christ has indeed been strong among you so that you will not be without any of the gifts of the Spirit while you are waiting for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed; and he will keep you steady and without blame until the last day, the day of our Lord Jesus Christ, because God by calling you has joined you to his Son, Jesus Christ; and God is faithful.*

Gospel - Mark 13 v. 33-37: "Be prepared" is the message. Jesus prepared for this world and also for eternity that can be ours when He returns in glory.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'Be on your guard, stay awake, because you never know when the time will come. It is like a man travelling abroad: he has gone from home, and left his servants in charge, each with his own task; and he has told the doorkeeper to stay awake. So stay awake, because you do not know when the master of the house is coming, evening, midnight, cockcrow, dawn; if he comes unexpectedly, he must not find you asleep. And what I say to you I say to all: Stay awake!'
